II. FUNCTIONS:

The HLGP Core team shall:

- 1) Formulate plan of operations for the program;
- 2) Facilitate engagement of municipalities to MLGP;
- 3) Jointly manage conduct of activities with ZFF and BSU-OU (or other academic partners);
- 4) Conduct meetings and performance reviews;
- 5) Coordinate with key players/ stakeholders as necessary;
- 6) Monitor and provide technical assistance for the over-all implementation of the project;
- 7) Prepare and submit physical and financial reports to DOH-CAR management;
- 8) Regularly report to the DOH management committee on program status;
- 9) Track and coordinate submission of coaching reports of DOH representatives; and
- 10) Perform other necessary related activities not mentioned above.

Under this order, office supplies, meals and snacks during meetings, travelling and other allowable expenses incurred by the committee members in performing their task shall be charged to LHSD funds, subject to the availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

This order shall take effect immediately.
