SUBJECT: Creation of the Disaster Risk Emergency Assessment Management (DREAM) Team of the DOH-CAR Office

Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) is performed during or in the immediate aftermath of an emergency to recognize and quantify the emergency and to readjust strategies and plans accordingly. Periodic assessments will further assist evaluation of the effectiveness of response and recovery and serve for financial and political advocacy, public information, press releases, and case studies. The RHA data would aid in vital decision-making and for feedback along the different levels of the health sector.

To ensure proper collection of subjective and objective information in order to measure damage and identify the basic needs of the affected population that require immediate response, the DOH-CAR Office DREAM Team is hereby created.

A consolidated team report shall immediately be transmitted to the Regional HEM OpCen by the Communications Officer, through call or text messaging, for prompt processing and allocation of needed logistics.

Likewise, any available driver is hereby directed to conduct the above mentioned DOH-CAR Personnel to the area/s requiring RHA using any vehicle available.

Under this order, transportation expenses, per diem and other allowable expenses relative to the travel of the above mentioned personnel shall be charged to DOH-CAR Office subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

A duly accomplished RHA report shall be submitted to the Regional HEM Cluster within 48 hours from the team's arrival for documentation.

The provisions of all previously issued Orders which are inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded. This order shall take effect immediately.
