**Procurement of Infrastructure Projects under Health Facilities and Enhancement Program (HFEP) for the Repair/Improvement/Upgrading/Completion of Baayan BHS**

**IB 2022-16**

This Addendum No. 2022-001 is issued to modify or amend the Bidding Documents for the Procurement of Repair/Improvement/Upgrading/Completion of Baayan BHS under IB 2022-16 for CY 2022 Requirements as published in the PhilGEPS last March 17, 2022 and to respond to the queries raised during the pre-bidding conference held on March 25, 2022.

Below is the amendment/correction to be reflected in the Bidding Documents:

1. Query raised by the Prospective Bidders

Particular	Query	Response
Bid Data Sheet: Key Personnel and Relevant Experience and Equipment	The personnel such as laborer, painter, electrician, and carpenter are included in the bidding documents that are not applicable to other projects, Can they identify the needed personnel of every facility/project?	End-user and TWG to review the personnel and identify what is applicable for every project/facility. Any change will be reflected in the supplemental bid bulletin
	Can we identify which project needs backhoe and dump truck since the need of dump truck and backhoe is not applicable to all projects? Is it also possible to commit one backhoe for several projects?	Can be allowed for projects that are near each other. This will depend on the proximity and distance of the projects (e.g., both projects are in Baguio City). The end-user and TWG will review the needed equipment and any change will be reflected in the supplemental bid bulletin
	In case the contractor owned a backhoe or dump truck, can we pledge it for more than one project?	Yes, Can be allowed depending on the proximity of the project site
	Do we need to attach a BIO data for every personnel including the plumber and laborer?	Yes, BIO Data of each personnel reflected in the organizational chart, should be attached. The needed personnel of each project

	Is it allowed, at least for bidding purposes only, to indicate a common civil engineer for various projects to be bid, and to assign one engineer per project if won several project?	Yes, this will be for bidding purposes only. However, in case the bidder won several projects, they should assign one engineer for every project to be approved by the procuring entity.
Single Largest Completed Contracts	What are the attachments of the Single Largest Completed Contract? Is Certificate of Completion enough?  What if the SLCC does not have yet the certificate of acceptance issued by the owner?	The attachments will be the ff: -contract -certificate of completion issued by the owner -certificate of acceptance issued by the owner.  Certificate of Completion will suffice, but should have an available and updated contact information of the owner of the project for verification by the TWG during post-qualification
	Is SLCC still needed for new licensed?	As specified in the revised IRR, for licenses for small A and small B category, SLCC is not required provided the project is within the allowable range of contract cost
